


Our Graduates

Salute to longtime SGS Member

Lewis O. Harris, Jr. was born in Greenfield, Massachusetts, and grew up on the family farm in East Deerfield until his mid-20s. He has had a life filled with family, varied interests, and contributions.

On the farm, he helped his father with raising turkeus but also spent time watching the old railroad roundhouse nearby. As a teenager, he and his buddies would bring their old cars to the farm to fix up and then race on oval dirt tracks in Massachusetts, Vermont, and Connecticut. They were some of the original hotrodders. Now that Lew has retired he watches car races on TV.



Lew moved to FL on Halloween 1969. Halloween is his birthday. He was an architectural draftsman. Before computers, he drew by hand steel construction plans. He drew plans for

hospitals, jails, airports, and hotels. After he retired computers did the work of hand-drawn draftsman.





He retired at age 62 1/2 to volunteer at the Palm Harbor Library. His sister Jeanette, who founded the Palm Harbor Library, needed someone on Tuesdays in the mornings to work the magazine donations.

Lew stayed on in the afternoons on Tuesdays to run the Suncoast Genealogy Society Help Desk. He has been a member of the SCGS since 1999, on the SGS Board of Directors from April 2006 to April 2018 and ran the used book sales at the seminars. He also ran the used book sales at the seminars, gathered the books and stored them during the year. He has worked at the Help Desk since 2000.

Lew became interested in genealogy from written family stories shared within the family and attending family reunions from different branches of his family. He joined "Sons of the American Revolution", and is still active in the Clearwater Chapter of SAR.

Lew is a Legacy in the Greater Gasparilla Distance Race. At 86 he is the oldest original runner. He has run every race for 46 years. This year he retired from running. He was honored at the GGDR press conference at the Columbia Restaurant in February of this year. Lew ran the New York Marathon in 1990.

Lew has many hobbies/interests that have kept him

busy. He is a Boston Red Sox fan still. His interest in railroads led to a model railroad display in his garage, which gives him a great deal of enjoyment. He also had fun playing golf. He has owned many Mustang cars and has rebuilt a 1970 Grabber Blue Mustang. He and his wife, Margaret, went on many Mustang Club tours of the United States and Canada.

Lew is lucky to have two sons and a daughter in the area. He enjoys the "family get-togethers" which happen often.
