Understanding Al in Genealogy: Foundations and Tools



Diana Elder AG, AGL

Learn how artificial intelligence can help with your family history research. This presentation covers what AI is, how it works, and which tools are most useful for genealogy. We'll look at popular AI assistants like ChatGPT, Claude, and Gemini and discuss what each one does best. You'll learn how to work effectively with AI, including how to ask questions that get the best results and how to verify the information it provides. Whether you're new to AI or already experimenting with it, this session will help you understand how to use these tools responsibly in your genealogy work.

THE SEARCHER

What unusual way have you found information about your ancestor My Cousin, Robert Girardi

For me the most unusual way to find ancestors had to do researching my adopted cousin. Adoption records have always been sealed by the court from public view. The records are kept at state level. And as you can expect each state's privacy laws are different, resulting in your research to be anything from a brickwall to varying degrees of difficulty.

At the time I did my research, Pennsylvania's adoption records were behind an impenetrable brickwall. This caused my cousin, Robert Girardi, persistent anguishing curiosity to know:

Who was he? Who gave him birth? What was his original name? And are there any relatives somewhere out there?

It wasn't until Robert reached middle age that some of the lifelong tormenting questions were answered. The revelations came from the efforts of an Uncle, the brother of his adoptive mother. By the best of good luck the Uncle made the right contacts to obtain a look at the secret papers and to take notes, but no copies. With this information Robert was able to meet his birth mother two times before she died and also a half-brother and half-sister.

Utilizing SGS's wonderful Help Desk, Lew Harris(now retired) provided me with credible documents from Ancestry.com. Lew was enormously helpful finding 77 relatives including their vital statistics spanning five generations in Pennsylvania and Virginia and also in Eastern Europe.

So what did I do with this Gold Mine of information? I wrote a 28-page Bio on Robert to include color and black & white photos. It was my Christmas gift to everyone in the Girardi Clan that I had addresses for. Like Robert we were all curious about his ancestry.


