CHARLES EDWARD FARRIS - Grand Dad

I think perhaps you might be interested in a few facts about Grand Dad and Grandma Farris. Now this is Harold's parents. I'm sure you remember how I really loved these people - and they loved me in return.

They both had a very hard childhood. I know it is very hard for us who have had loving parents and been cared for all our lives to imagine what some children have to go through to just have a place to live.

First, I'll tell you bout Grand Dad. His father was in the Civil War, he was a Sergeant. He picked up some disease while in the service - I think it was chronic dysentery many of the soldiers had died from that. Grand Dad was just a very young child at that time a very young child at that time. I think he had three a very young child at that time. I think he had three brothers and three sisters and when he was four years old his mother died. None of the children were old enough to his mother died. None of the children were old enough to take care of the two youngest boys so he and his brother. Jess, were sent to an orphanage which was an orphanage for dependent children of soldiers. It was located in Davennort, love.

By the stories Grand Dad told us it just wasn't the best place to be raised. They soon found out they had to Davenport, Iowa. fight for what they wanted.

There was a fife and drum corp made up of the orphanage children and Grand Dad just wanted so badly to belong in it, but he didn't have an instrument. In his little mind he knew he had to have something to help him learn the rhythm of the munic. So he took his neglet bride out and out the music, so he took his pocket knife out and cut a piece of wood out of the window sill and carved himself a set of "bones". The way you played the bones was you held them between you fingers in one hand and hit them together and keep time with the music. After he got the hang of keeping time with the music he was sure he could teach himself to play the drums. So now he had to have some drum sticks, so play the drums. So now he had to have some drum sticks, so he found an old wooden chair seat and carved a pair of drum sticks. When the fife and drum practiced Grand Dad played right along with them on any surface that was handy.

One day the corp master said he needed a drummer and wondered if anyone knew how to play the drums. Grand Dad was ready when the opportunity came along and he was in. can just see him in my minds eye - a little fellow - 9 or 10 years old - with his little back so straight marching so proudly in step with the fife and drum corp.

I don't know if the house mother ever found out about the window sill that was ruined, he never told us that if she did.

Jay now has the "Bones" as a keepsake from Grand Dad. when we would go out to visit when the children were young, Grand Dad always had to play the "Bones" for them.

Grand Dad was determined to leave the orphanage at the very first opportunity. When he was 15 years old his sister, Ida, had married and she asked him to come to Ohio to be with her. After he became 16 he worked in a table factory. Then later on he worked on the railroad. The family moved back to Iowa and Grand Dad started to work for different farmers. He evidently liked farming because he remained a farmer the rest of his life.
