President's Message







MY IMMIGRATANT ANCESTOR

William R. Matthews (1817 Wales - 1901 Pennsylvania)

My 2nd great-grandfather William R. Matthews, was born in Castleton, Monmouthshire, Wales to Richard and Mary Matthews. Richard was a farmer near the Bristol Channel and later a collier in southeastern Wales as the Industrial Revolution began with a growing demand for coal and iron. Both Richard and Mary died in Wales, he in 1870 and she in 1865.

William had two brothers who also immigrated to the United States, Thomas to Kansas and John to near William in Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. I discovered Thomas from DNA matches to cousins in Kansas and Missouri. John I knew about from researching William and have discovered DNA matches from descendants of all three of them.

William married Catherine Evans in Wales in 1838 and they had five children when they immigrated to the US in 1851. William was a collier in Wales and I have to think from the dreadful working conditions in the mines that it was an easy decision to emigrate to a better life. Sadly, their youngest child, a daughter Catherine, died at age 2 on the voyage to New York.



By 1854 William and his family had made their way to Danville, PA, on the Susquehanna River, where there was work in coal and iron mines. Danville was a transportation center between the coal docks in Pittston and Wilkes-Barre, connecting to Harrisburg. In Pennsylvania, William and Catherine added six more children to their family.



The family moved north on the Susquehanna River to Luzerne County and by 1870 William had a farm in Spring Brook Township. In 1878 Lackawanna County was created from a portion of Luzerne County, including Spring Brook and the city of Scranton.

William was a deeply religious man and in the 1880 census is a Methodist Priest. In the 1880 “History of Luzerne, Lackawanna and Wyoming Counties of Pennsylvania”, where the hamlet Spring Brook is described, William is listed as the pastor of the Calvinistic Methodist church. In 1900 William is living with his son Thomas’ family, and Thomas by coincidence was also the 1900 census enumerator.

Catherine died in 1887 in Olyphant, PA and William in 1901 in Spring Brook.

William and his family sailed on the “Queen of the West”, a well-known packet ship. By chance, it is mentioned in an article in the “Illustrated London News” - The Tide of Emigration to the United States and the British Colonies, 6 Jul 1850. I have found a great deal of information on the family from UK/Wales and US censuses, ship passenger lists, church records, newspaper articles and other places. I’m happy to share my research upon request.


